Surrendering to His Sacrifice

That's this year's theme for our Lenten Journey to Calvary with Christ Jesus. And, boy, is it ever a journey that we all want to make with Him! Two thousand years ago, on a cross Jesus sacrificed His perfect life to *forgive* and to *set us free from* our sins, "once for all." In other words, Jesus' sacrifice for us is an already accomplished fact, a done deal. "It is finished!" He has told us. But that does not mean that we have already been forgiven, or set free from, these sins. No, that comes through the ongoing process of repentance and forgiveness, which the Holy Spirit works in our heads and in our hearts through God's Word and through the Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper.

So this Lenten season, we're not going to journey to the cross empty handed.

We are going to be invited to bring our *hypocrisy*, our *disobedience*, our *greed*, our *self-absorption*, our *defiant will* and our *pride* to Jesus, to lay these sins down at the foot of His cross, and to *surrender them to His forgiving and liberating sacrifice for our sins*.

Our Lenten Journey begins at **7:15 PM on Ash Wednesday, March 9**, with the prophet's call to "**rend our hearts and not our garments.**" It will continue on the following five Wednesday evenings. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday will build on this theme in dramatic fashion. Our journey will culminate with the

celebration of Christ's resurrection and our new life in Him on Easter Sunday, April 24.

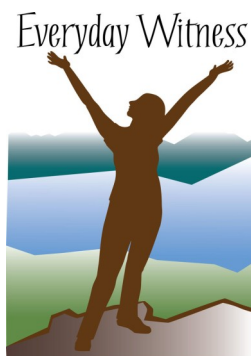
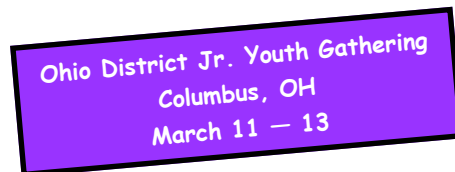

School Mission and Ministry News

Registration for the 2011-2012 school year is going very well. **We have openings in the two-year-old, four-year-old PM, Pre-Kindergarten (older 4s/young 5s), and Kindergarten classes. If you know of someone who is looking for a quality, Christian program please have them give me a call.**

The feedback from the parent/teacher conferences was very positive. Parents have been impressed with what their children have been learning and have been especially thankful for the time spent teaching the children about Jesus and His love. Please keep this program in your prayers. The staff needs the strength that comes only from God to carry out this mission.

February was a month filled with LOVE in the two & three year-old room where the children had a lot of fun with their Valentine Parties. The love of God for His creation is always the focus for Valentine's Day. They made and gave Valentines to their families and classmates. The children learned that Jesus had 12 special friends who helped Him tell people about God's love. The children were excited to learn that Jesus also loved children! They learned that Jesus showed His love by helping people. The children decorated with hearts, played with heart shapes and included them in all their art work. They especially loved singing "Jesus Loves Me" and "I Love Jesus Does He Know?" (Mrs. Anne Hankins & Mrs. Katie Armstead)

The three and four-year-old class focused on loving others as we love ourselves. Valentine's Day is a great way to remind us to be kind to others by sharing, smiling at each other, and giving forgiveness when someone is sorry. The children had a unit on nutrition good health and hygiene. They discovered that God gave them five senses to enjoy His beautiful world. The children enjoyed their sense of taste the most! They learned that Jesus is so powerful that He could take 5 loaves of bread, 2 fish and feed 5,000 people! They continue to work on numbers and letters. They have enjoyed "The Doors to Discovery" and learning what sound each letter makes. We are reminded daily of God's amazing grace through your children's smiling faces. The four and five-year-old class started February with the letter "N." The children made a Night picture and counted Nine Numbers. They learned that Jesus loves them with a never ending love. The children learned about the love of our God, our families, and our love for each other. The children made a Night picture and counted Nine Numbers. For the letter "O" the children played with Oatmeal, made an Owl, and put an Octopus in the Ocean. The children ended the month with the story of Mary and Martha, they learned how to be more like Mary and listen to the Word of God. (Mrs. Teri Hockman and Mrs. Leslie Martin)

The Pre-Kindergarten class had a unit on Fire Prevention & Safety. They made fireman hats and used police and firemen's dress-up clothes for dramatic play. Many of them learned their phone number and address and how and when to dial 911, which can help them stay safe. As a community service project, they decorated 40 bags for Meals on Wheels to use in sending their Valentine treats. They learned the steps required for the post office to deliver the mail. One of our parents, who is a postman, visited to talk about the post office. The next unit was nutrition. The class learned about the five food groups, and that God wants us to eat healthy and gave us wonderful things to eat. With our healthy bodies we are able to tell others about Jesus, as they learned Peter and Lydia did long ago. (Mrs. Samara and Mrs. Christina Jacobsen)

Kindergarten made it to the 100th day of school and it was quite a celebration! The children have a reading vocabulary of several hundred words and are great at spelling and writing. They learned about telling time and counting money. They enjoyed learning about dinosaurs and exploring their five senses. Valentine friends and fun fit right in with the Bible explorations. 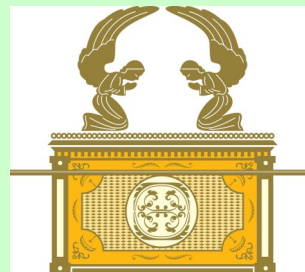
